3. Check out

Sentence: We checked out of the hotel before noon.

4. Take off



Meaning: When an airplane leaves the ground.

Sentence: The flight took off an hour late due to bad weather.


5. Get in



Meaning: To arrive at a destination.

Sentence: What time does your train get in?

6. Get away



Sentence: We're planning to get away for the weekend.

7. Hold up



Meaning: To delay or cause a delay.

Sentence: The traffic jam held us up for over an hour.

8. Pick up



Meaning: To collect someone or something.

Sentence: Can you pick me up from the airport?

9. Drop off



Meaning: To leave someone or something at a place.

Sentence: I'll drop you off at the station on my way to work.

10. Look around



Meaning: To explore a place.

Sentence: We spent the afternoon looking around the city center.

11. Catch up



Meaning: To reach someone or something after falling behind.

Sentence: You go ahead; I'll catch up with you later.

12. Get on



Meaning: To board a vehicle, train, or plane.

Sentence: He got on the bus just before it left.

13. Get off



Meaning: To leave a vehicle, train, or plane.

Sentence: She got off the train at the next station.

14. Run out of



Meaning: To use up all of something.

Sentence: We ran out of gas halfway to our destination.

15. Take in



Meaning: To visit and enjoy sights or experiences.

Sentence: We took in the breathtaking views from the mountain top.

16. Turn back



Meaning: To return to where you started.

Sentence: We had to turn back because the road was closed.


17. See off

Sentence: We stopped over in Dubai on our way to Australia.
